Camp Goals

The goal of Mooers Camp is to lead unsaved teens to Christ, deepen teen's relationship with God, and teach and equip them to fulfill Jesus' command in Matthew 28:19.

"Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit."

General Responsibility

To carry out camp programs and identify and meet camper needs.

Specific Responsibilities

1. Learn the likes/ dislikes of each participant.
2. Guide cabin groups and individual campers in participating successfully in all aspects of camp activities.
3. Carry out established roles for supervising camper health.
4. Carry out established roles in enforcing camp safety regulations.
5. Supervise all assigned aspects of the campers' day including daily activities, cabin clean-up, meal times, rest periods, evening activities, getting ready for bed, and after-hours duty as assigned.
6. Instruct campers in emergency procedures such as fire drills, evacuating the cabin, etc.
7. Assist in teaching or leading an activity, as assigned.
8. Prepare for and actively participate in staff training and meetings
9. Set a good example for campers and others including cleanliness, punctuality, sharing clean-up and chores, sportsmanship, and participation.
10. Follow camp rules and regulations pertaining to smoking, use of alcoholic beverages, and use of drugs.
11. Encourage respect for personal property, camp equipment, and facilities.
12. Manage personal time off in accordance with camp policy.
13. Maintain good public relations with campers' parents and other adults on camp grounds.
14. These are not the only duties to be performed. Some duties may be reassigned and other duties may be assigned as required.
